

Total Pelvic Suprlevator Exenteration with Ileo-Colic Orthotopic Neobladder for Locoregional Recurrence after Cervical Cancer - A Case Report

Abstract

Pelvic exenteration is one of the most aggressive surgical interventions in gynaecologic surgical oncology, but, in the same time, is the only potentially curative treatment of locoregional recurrence after cervical cancer. Due to improvements in surgical technique and postoperative management, the overall survival increased significantly in the last decades. Trying to improve the quality of life, multiple models of reconstruction of urinary and digestive tract have been developed. In this report we present the case of a 51 years old female who underwent a total suprlevator exenteration with ileo colic neobladder reconstruction with good oncologic and functional outcomes.
